

THE ROLE OF A STATE UNDER REVIEW AT THE UPR

<u>UPR Stage:</u>	<u>Timeline:</u>	<u>What to do:</u>
<u>Before the Review</u>	Review (R) – 12 months	Hold national consultations with the civil society for the drafting of the National Report.
	R – 3 months	Submit a report on the human rights situation to be used as a basis for the review. The document should not to exceed 20 pages.
<u>During the Review</u>	R	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Present its National Report. • Answer to the advance written questions. • Answer to questions coming from States during the interactive dialogue.
<u>Between the Review and the Adoption of the Report in the Working Group</u>	R + 1 to 3 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide preliminary responses to the recommendations received • Finalize the report of the Working Group with the Troika members.
<u>Adoption of the Report in the Working Group</u>	R + 3 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Comment on the Review.
<u>Between the Adoption in the WG and the Plenary</u>	R + 1 to 4 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Submit an addendum explaining its responses to each recommendations
<u>Adoption in the Plenary session of the Human Rights Council</u>	R + 4 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Present final responses with an effort to comment on the reasons for rejection. • Answer to questions from States and civil society
<u>Between two Reviews</u>	R + 1 to 4,5 years	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Implement the recommendations. • Engage in dialogue with the civil society to involve them in the implementation. • Prepare for the next Review.
