# ORAL STATEMENT UPR Pre-session on Cambodia Geneva, 13 February 2024 Delivered by: Child Rights Coalition Cambodia (CRC-Cambodia)

#### [slide 1] Excellencies, esteemed participants

I am the director of the Child Rights Coalition Cambodia. It is my great pleasure to deliver a statement - on behalf of our coalition and children of Cambodia.

[slide 2] Our coalition was established in 1994 and we have 60 members today. We also coordinate 3 child and youth-led networks. Almost 60 children and youth from these networks contributed to the development of our UPR submission and 27 to the development of this statement.

#### Slide 3

## 1. The first issue of concern is education.

- During the previous UPR cycle, Cambodia received and accepted 20 recommendations related to education.
- Due to insufficient public investment in the education sector, adopted policies haven't yet been put fully into practice. Trends are positive, but still only 30% of children finish secondary school and only 1 in 10 achieve minimum foundational skills.

## We would like to ask UN Members states to consider recommending Cambodia to:

• Increase the annual budget allocation for education - to improve the quality of education - at all levels, especially in rural areas.

- 2. The second priority is the impact of climate change on children.
- In the previous UPR cycle, Cambodia received and accepted **one** recommendation on this matter; and it has been partially implemented so far.
- Cambodian climate policies recognise children as a vulnerable group, but schools are not adapted to increasing temperatures and more than 50% students reported suffering from heat and unable to focus on study. Children's views have not been considered in climate action and decisions so far.

## We would like to ask UN Members states to consider recommending Cambodia to:

• Follow the advice of the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child included in its General Comment 26 and specifically recognise children's rights to a safe, healthy and sustainable environment - by law and with its all elements - including procedural.

## 3. The third priority is related to equality and non-discrimination.

- In the previous cycle, Cambodia received and accepted 15 recommendations addressing violence and discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity and expression and sex characteristics and gender-based discrimination and violence.
- A Law on Child Protection has been drafted, with a comprehensive chapter on protection from sexual violence including online, but its approval has been stalled.
- Despite the integration of SOGIESC-related topics into school programs, girls and children with diverse SOGIESC remain exposed to discrimination, bullying and violence.

#### Slide 8

#### We would like to ask UN Members states to recommend Cambodia to:

• Build capacities of educational institutions to ensure they are fully inclusive of all children, without discrimination of any kind, including discrimination based on diverse SOGIESC.

# Slide 9

4. Child marriage is another serious issue.

- In the previous UPR cycle, Cambodia received one recommendation related to this, and since then only one project has been piloted so far.
- 20% of women are married before 18, and with this, risks of early pregnancy, drop-out of school and violence increase.

## Slide 10

#### We would like to ask UN Members states to recommend Cambodia to

Develop a national action plan to prevent child marriage and teenage pregnancy and allocate appropriate resources for its implementation, and ensure girls are involved in the development and implementation of this plan.
