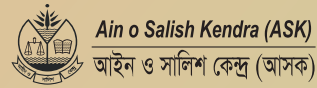

## Developed for the 4<sup>th</sup> cycle of Universal Periodic Review (UPR) of Bangladesh

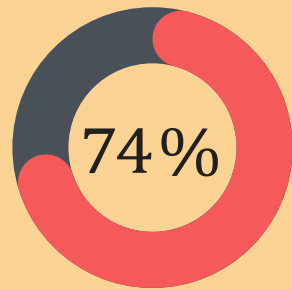
These fact sheets have been jointly prepared by (CRAC,B), a national platform of ten national and international organisations and networks and Joining Forces Bangladesh (JFB), a global platform of six leading international child rights development organisations.

The purpose of these fact sheets is to highlight the advancements made by the government in implementing recommendations focused on children since the third cycle of the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) in 2018. Additionally, they also include the existing challenges and recommendations to address them.

### Summary of Key Issues from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Cycle:



During the third cycle, Bangladesh supported 40 out of 54 recommendations related to children's rights, and 14 were noted. Among them, CRAC,B and JFB identified 40 recommendations aligned with their strategic priorities for further analysis. After a careful analysis, it is evident that none of these recommendations was fully implemented, 36 of them were partially implemented and 4 of them were not implemented.
