Human Rights Council 27 Session, item 6: Consideration of UPR outcomes, Norway 18 September 2014

Norwegian statement by Ambassador Steffen Kongstad

President,

I am pleased to address the Council in connection with the adoption of the outcome of Norway's second Universal Periodic Review.

Norway strongly supports the UPR process, which represents a unique opportunity for all countries to undertake a review of their human rights situation.

Throughout the process, we have had a transparent cooperation with civil society. A draft report was circulated among civil society actors in Norway, and they were invited to give their views. Their critical assessment and constructive advice on areas where there was disagreement with the government or where it was deemed that we need to improve, has been of key importance to the process. The UPR has contributed to a strengthened dialogue between civil society and Norwegian authorities on a range of human rights related issues.

We received 203 recommendations on a number of issues, including the establishment of a new National Institution, ratification of international instruments, racism, discrimination, violence against women, to mention some.

Norway welcomes all the recommendations made during the review. Each of them has been subject to careful consideration by relevant authorities. We have accepted 150 recommendations. In our response to the recommendations, we have made extensive comments. We have also explained why we are not in a position to accept certain recommendations.

I would like to thank the missions that contributed to what we see as a useful dialogue during the review of Norway. Allow me also to thank the representatives from civil society for their many and constructive contributions. Civil society has a crucial role in making the UPR a credible and useful process.
