The Act criminalizes foreign funded NGOs which engage in ‘anti-state activities’ or make ‘inimical’ or ‘derogatory’ comments about the Constitution and constitutional institutions of Bangladesh; ‘inimical’ and ‘derogatory’ are undefined and can result in de-registration (articles 6, 19 and 22). In a 2014 letter to the Prime Minister, Lawyers Rights Watch Canada and the Centre for Law and Democracy expressed concern over several provisions in the Bill relating to freedom of association, freedom of expression, and the amount of government control over NGOs allowed by the Bill.
